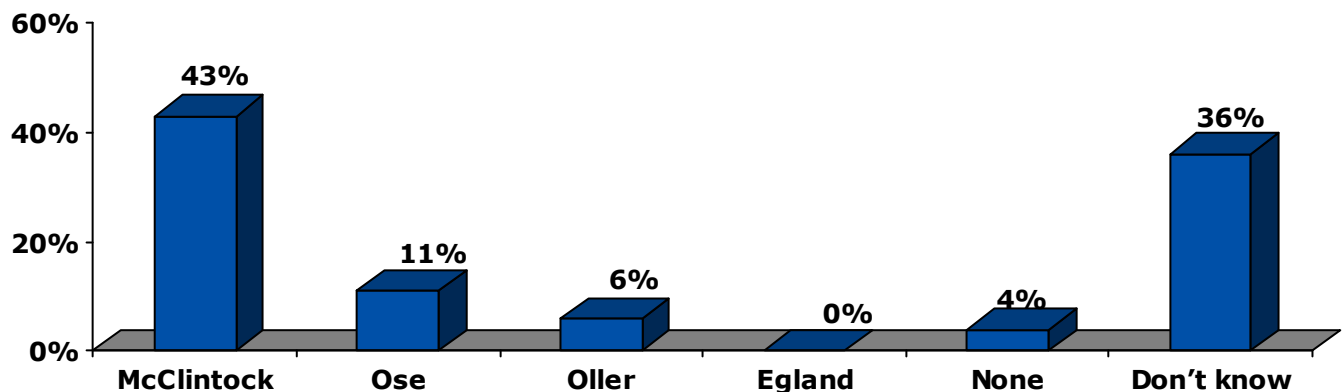

RE: California Congressional District Four GOP Survey Results

This memo contains results of a telephone survey conducted by Moore Information, among a representative sample of 300 likely Republican Primary voters in California's Fourth Congressional District. The interviews were conducted February 11-12, 2008. The potential sampling error is plus or minus 6% at the 95% confidence level.

State Senator Tom McClintock would be a favorite to win the GOP nomination for Congress in California's Fourth Congressional District. In a poll of GOP voters in the district, conducted February 11-12, McClintock leads with 43% distantly followed by Doug Ose with 11% and Rico Oller with 6%. No respondent planned to vote for Eric Egland and 36% are undecided.

McClintock is the favorite among GOP men and women, in all age groups, in all counties and among Liberals, Moderates and Conservatives alike.

McClintock leads because he is more well known and popular than any of the other possible GOP candidates. Currently, 54% of district GOP voters have a favorable opinion, while only 5% have an unfavorable opinion of McClintock. The remaining 41% have no opinion or have never heard of McClintock.

By comparison, Ose's image numbers are 31% favorable, 3% unfavorable and 66% no opinion/never heard. Oller's numbers are 24/6/70% and Egland's are 3/2/95%.
